

Gov Affairs committee report to GH Chamber 4-9-19

(don't recall seeing anything esnt out to our members from last months GA mtg. If we consider Gov Affairs to be an asset to our members they need to know what we are doing)

Last week we had reps from Supervisor Barger, Assembly Smith, and CD12 at last Tuesday's GA mtg

Jason/ Barger: report on proposal to haul and dump some debris from Woosley fire to Sunshine Canyon Landfill County to review system of contracting out to small business  
Immediately cease the County depts. use of Glyphosate (RoundUP) and report back on alternatives

Ryan/ Smith: Focus on Budget; against bullet train;

AB308 coauthor of bill stated as "small business tax" amendment bill that merely extends annual \$800 fee for corporations exemption for members of the armed forces. While it was going through the writing process, the bill had a provision to reduce the \$800 to \$400 for almost every corporation.

AB1508 is a bill that she co-introduced and we in Granada Hills need to keep a close eye on. It would give LAUSD a lot more powers to deny a Charter school their right to open or stay open. Granada High is renewed every 5 years – next will be 2024

Jessie/CD12 Smith: CityWide Planning Design Guidelines are being updated, public comment ends May23;  
Program to allow up to 20,000 scooters from 3 companies

The committee voted to have the Chamber take a NO position on prop EE that will be n our June 4<sup>th</sup> Ballot. It will be a parcel tax on all parcels within the LAUSD district amounting to 16 cents/sq foot of improved properties – buildings both commercial and residential The board needs a formal vote.

UCC: CM Koretz is concerned about AB58 which would extend alcohol sales to 4am. Gov Brown vetoed a similar bill last year saying nothing good happens after 2am.

Growing concern over SB50 which would give the state control over local planning and zoning, allowing 4-8 story housing in virtually any area and do away with any parking requirements.

CF 19-0101 City Council adopted a motion to have City Attorney prepare an ordinance requiring all employers to supplement the state programs in order for parents to take 18 weeks off with full pay.

Next UCC gov Affairs mtg is next Monday the 15<sup>th</sup>; The topic will Be Proposition EE, there will be presentations from both sides of the issue leading to a vote for a formal position.

Locally, the issue of that marijuana store on Chatsworth was brought to the attention of this chamber and last week at the South Council....
